

Yunnan College of Business Management undergraduate graduation thesis (design) academic misconduct

Measures for Determining and Handling Behavior (Trial)

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In order to standardize the management of undergraduate graduation thesis (design), establish a good academic style, and improve the quality of talent training, these measures are specially formulated in accordance with the Regulations of the People's Republic of China on Academic Degrees, the Higher Education Law of the People's Republic of China and other relevant regulations.

Chapter 1 General Provisions

Article 1 Undergraduate students shall abide by academic ethics and academic norms, and independently complete their undergraduate thesis (design) under the guidance of their supervisors.

Article 2 Instructors shall educate undergraduates on academic ethics and academic norms, and guide the research and writing process of their graduation thesis (design).

Article 3 Each college shall establish a graduation thesis (design) review system. Conduct academic integrity review of undergraduate thesis (design), and the review results are used as the basic basis for determining academic misconduct in graduation thesis (design).

Chapter 2 Scope of application

Article 4 Buying or selling graduation thesis (design) or organizing the sale of graduation thesis (design).

Article 5 Writing or writing graduation thesis (design) for others or organizing graduation thesis writing by others.

Article 6: Plagiarizing other people's works and academic achievements as follows:

(1) Continuously quoting other people's works for more than 200 words without

indicating the source;

(2) Using data, charts, and other content published by others without authorization or without attribution;

(3) Reproducing the original text or copying the content of other people's works by changing individual words, phrases, and rearranging sentences exceeds 30% of the total number of words in the paper written by the person (except for citing laws and regulations, government documents, current affairs news, famous quotes, classic poems, ancient books, recognized principles, methods and formulas, general number tables, etc.);

(4) Directly translating documents or changing words or rearranging sentence order in translation for their own papers, and the total number of words exceeds 30% of the total number of words in the papers they have written;

(5) Copying experimental results and analysis, system design, and problem solving methods in other people's papers or works without indicating the source or indicating the source of reference;

(6) Other acts identified as plagiarism by the school's academic committee.

Suspected plagiarism other than the above two situations is not considered plagiarism if it has any of the following circumstances:

(7) The form of expression is the same or similar, but it is indeed obtained by two independent creative activities;

(8) Translating, commenting, introducing, or reviewing other people's works and noting that they will not be generally mistaken for their originality;

(9) Drawing on the experimental methods and means, experimental equipment and instruments of others to draw different experimental results and conclusions;

(10) Able to provide detailed original materials and data to prove that the work was originally created by oneself;

(11) Using other people's works as research objects for special research and citing no more than 50% of the work;

(12) Other acts determined by the school's academic committee to be non-plagiarism.

Article 7 Falsifying data;

Article 8 There are other serious academic misconduct in the graduation thesis (design).

Article 9 Academic misconduct in undergraduate graduation thesis (design) (including thesis, design, physical education, and art majors) shall be dealt with in accordance with these Measures.

Chapter III Handling Measures

Article 10: Papers that have been identified as plagiarism are classified into three categories: light, moderate, and serious plagiarism.

(1) If it has been determined to be plagiarism, and the content that is duplicated with other people's papers or works accounts for less than 40% (including 40%) of the total number of words in the paper, it may be recognized as mild plagiarism;

(2) If it has been determined to be plagiarism, and the content that is duplicated with other people's papers or works accounts for 40%-50% (including 50%) of the total number of words in the paper, it may be recognized as moderate plagiarism;

(3) It has been determined to be plagiarism, and the content that is duplicated with other people's papers or works accounts for more than 50% of the total number of words in the paper; or the full text of the citation does not indicate the source and is generally mistaken for its originality; or regardless of the number of repeated words, if the core ideas, key arguments, and key data charts expressed in the expression plagiarize others, it may be deemed serious plagiarism.

Article 11 If the undergraduate graduation thesis (design) is verified to be purchased, written (done) by others, seriously plagiarized or falsified data, or other academic misconduct, the school will cancel its bachelor's degree application qualifications, and give the student probation and expulsion depending on the circumstances. If a bachelor's degree has been obtained, the bachelor's degree shall be revoked in accordance with the law and the degree certificate shall be cancelled.

Article 12: Persons who contact (do) or sell graduation theses (designs) for others, or organize the sale or ghostwriting (doing) of graduation theses (designs) are undergraduates, and the school will give them probation and expulsion depending on the circumstances; Those belonging to school teachers and other staff shall be reported to the school discipline inspection and supervision department for handling, and those who violate the law shall be handed over to the judicial organs for handling.

Article 13 If it is found to be mild or moderate plagiarism, the graduation project (thesis) must be revised and improved by the instructor and student, and the graduation thesis plagiarism check and defense shall be carried out with the next batch of students.

Article 14 If the academic misconduct of the undergraduate graduation thesis (design) violates relevant laws and regulations, the relevant legal responsibility shall be investigated in accordance with the law.

Chapter IV Handling Institutions and Procedures

Article 15 Each college has the educational responsibility and obligation to prevent academic misconduct in undergraduate graduation thesis (design) and standardize academic ethics, and is responsible for reviewing the undergraduate graduation thesis (design) of the college. All undergraduate thesis (design) must be formally reviewed by the college using a combination of computer thesis detection system and manual review before submitting the defense application.

Article 16 The institution that accepts reports of academic misconduct in undergraduate graduation thesis (design) is the Teaching Work Department.

Article 17 Whistleblowers of academic misconduct in undergraduate thesis (design) must report in their real name and provide detailed evidence before accepting it.

Article 18: The Teaching Work Department may entrust or designate the Teaching Steering Committee to determine the behavior and extent of plagiarism, and submit written preliminary determination results and handling opinions to the Academic Committee of the school.

The Academic Committee of the College is the final institution for academic misconduct in the undergraduate graduation thesis (design) within the school. For those who are found to be directly responsible for plagiarism, the school's academic committee shall make a final review.

Article 19 If the informant or the party has any objection to the determination result of the college or the teaching work department, he may appeal to the academic committee of the school within 10 working days of receiving the determination result and handling opinions.

Chapter V Supplementary Provisions

Article 20 These Measures shall be implemented from the date of promulgation, and the Teaching Work Department shall be responsible for interpretation.
